Worthy Brother Knights of the Arch,

It's hard to be unhappy when the temperature in mid-March is hitting the mid-70's! And it's hard to be unhappy when Ohio and the Arch are climbing upwards towards our Membership goals! But as we in Ohio know, the tease is often followed by the cold truth! And that applies to both the weather and Membership! We can't really help the surprises of Spring weather – but we can do something about keeping the Arch, Ohio, and the Order growing with new men!

As I write this, our March numbers look good! We need to keeping our sense of mission strong and step out in faith to invite men to join us. This should be everyone's priority – not just the Grand Knight or Membership Director. There are ample opportunities as we journey through Lent towards the joy of the Easter season to do a bit of recruitment: retreats, Confirmations, Supercash sales, Fish Frys. All of these are wonderful moments when we can show the strength of our unity to our parishes – and ask someone to consider joining us! The Lenten season offers a wonderful chance to combine your recruiting effort with a COR event, allowing you to invite non-Knights to witness the power we have in our unity of faith, as well as our charity.

March and October are NOT the "only" two months when you can do a Delta Church Drive. Any time – and for any reason – is adequate – **recruiting is not a** *date*, **it's a** *mindset*! Ask your pastor about a date for a church drive, then put a team in place to take maximum advantage of it. Remember that getting the word out prior to that date helps drive awareness of your effort and a starting point in inviting men to join your council. Delta Church Drives, if done correctly (i.e. following the plan and timing Supreme has laid out) – will bring at least three new members into your council. It's not hard, but it does take a bit of persistence and the help of your follow Knights.

When you get a candidate, get him to a CUF Degree as soon as possible! Be sure your council has a CUF team ready to go or volunteer to lead one if your council doesn't. Do a degree once a month, more if needed – try to plan a degree where a man's family can attend as well. The sooner a man (and his family) is a member of a council, the more likely he'll be to stay involved! Be sure your programs offer something for everyone to participate in, so they'll feel involved. And consider family-oriented activities so that the whole family can participate!

Both of your Archdiocese Growth Coordinators (Vic & Mark) as well as your council's District Deputy are ready and willing to assist your councils in setting up and running Delta in your parish (or parishes for those councils with multiple Beacons parishes) or other types of recruiting efforts based on your local needs.

Above all, be ready to talk about being a Knight of Columbus. Keep it short and keep it personal. Just as we need to witness to our Faith, we need to witness to being a Knight. Keep the eMembership page bookmarked on your phone so you can call it up quickly. Be sure your prospect knows your council number and can apply it in the eMembership form. Every Catholic man should have the opportunity to be a Knight of Columbus! Someone once asked each of us to join - now it's our turn to go out and ask someone else!

The state team has taken a page from the Archdiocese playbook...





Devoted to the Heart of Jesus Pilgrim Icon

Spread devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and pray for Our Lord to make his heart our own, so that we may see and love in others what he sees and loves in us.

Through the Pilgrim Icon Program, councils organize a Sacred Heart Holy Hour featuring an icon depicting the most famous image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, painted in 1767 by Pompeo Batoni and now venerated in the Church of the Gesù in Rome. The reproduction bears the blessing of Pope Francis, through the Papal Almoner, and is one of more than 300 icons traveling across the world, from council to council, for veneration and use in prayer services.

The Sacred Heart Holy Hour includes readings from Sacred Scripture and reflections from Pope Francis on the Sacred Heart, as

well as the Divine Mercy Chaplet, prayers to the Sacred Heart and time for silent prayer. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament may also be included. Following the holy hour, families are encouraged to enthrone the Sacred Heart in their homes by placing an image of the Sacred Heart in a place of honor and conducting an enthronement ceremony.

Since the first traveling pilgrim icon of Our Lady of Guadalupe in 1979, more than 191,000 council and parish prayer services with some 23 million participants have been held.
